October Mission Month 2020

Archbishop Kieran O'Reilly, SMA writes:

"Two significant events mark our October Mission Month 2020, the first and the most immediate being the COVID-19 Pandemic which is still raging throughout our world. Indeed, our world, especially the most disadvantaged areas, will be dealing with the effects of this pandemic, according to the experts, for many years to come.

The second significant event to be recalled this Mission Month is the publication of the document *Querida Amazonia* (Beloved Amazonia) from Pope Francis earlier this year. Tragically, we now learn that the COVID-19 pandemic is doing terrible damage to the little communities scattered throughout this vast region. Pope Francis calls for a renewed commitment to the Gospel of hope and life in the Amazon region.

He reminds us that we are all in the same boat on this small planet of ours whether we live in Ireland or in the distant lands of the Amazon: 'We have realised that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented, but at the same time, important and needed, all of us called to row together, each of us in need of comforting the other,' From this pandemic, Pope Francis said, we 'have realised that we cannot go on thinking of ourselves, but only together can we do this.'"

This year's Mission Month theme <u>'Together we can do more - Blessed are the peacemakers'</u> is highlighting that our Church is a global community that must stand together if it is to do more. The theme also recognises our missionaries as peacemakers.

In many of our poorer parishes in Africa, Asia, and Latin America, it is missionaries who are on the front line. We already owe these women and men so much, as they walk hand-in-hand with marginalised communities, long before and after any emergency.

Just like Jesus, the Prince of Peace, missionaries emulate love and harmony as they reconcile fragile people, from fractured communities, with God and with each other.

Readings for 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is. 5:1-7. If a vineyard that has had everything possible done for it, produces only sour grapes, then it can be expected that a Master will withdraw his care and allow it to go to ruin. The vineyard was an Old Testament metaphor for the people of Israel. Isaiah wrote this over 100 years before the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile of her people.

Phil. 4:6-9. Paul writing from prison in Rome is coming to the end of his letter to his dear friends at Philippi. "Never worry...but tell God of all your desires ...and your gratitude. And that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts in Christ Jesus." The date is about 63 ad. **Mt. 21:33-43**. Addressing the chief priests and elders Jesus uses a parable beloved of the prophets and familiar to his hearers. But he inserts the son of the master of the vineyard into the story. "They will respect my son." But the tenants kill him too. Yet God will raise and make him into "the keystone" of salvation. "...and it is wonderful to see." So the Kingdom would be taken from the first century Jews to be received gratefully by non-Jews. They too in their turn must produce the required fruit
