THE RICH YOUNG MAN

This exchange between Jesus and the rich man is often read with Matthew's parallel in mind, where Jesus tells the young man to sell his possessions 'if you would be perfect'. There are no such phrases in Mark's story. The questioner has reached a certain age, for he has kept the commandments 'from my earliest days'. He is in the full flush of wealth, and getting rid of his riches is not a mere counsel of perfection for this particular man.

Jesus is stressing the danger of possessions for everyone. It is a curious fact that for many people, the more they have, the more they want. Conversely, the less people have, the more generous they can be drawn to be, knowing the value to other needy people because of the little they have. It is not merely that we need to be free of the preoccupations and distractions of wealth. Wealth can be a good preoccupation if the worry comes from awareness of the responsibility it brings.

Repeatedly, however, in the history of the Church, from St Anthony of the Desert, St Francis of Assisi and others, people have interpreted these words of Jesus in this gospel in a heroic manner, and have stripped themselves of all possessions to concentrate on the Kingdom of God. God's blessing is especially on the poor.

How does the danger of possessions affect me? Am I generous with what I have?

MISSION MONTH

- October is Mission Month in the Church. It is also a Marian month meaning we are encouraged to pray the Rosary each day.
- Mission Month culminates in World Mission Sunday which is the Holy Father's annual direct appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of missionaries can continue. This year World Mission Sunday is on 24th October.
- World Mission Sunday collections take place in every single parish where the Church is present. This includes not only Ireland and across Europe, but also in poorer parishes in the developing world.

The theme for this year's Mission Month in Ireland is *We cannot remain silent - we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard*. This message is twofold. It is a message of hope: Jesus Christ is risen and we cannot keep his love, compassion and mercy to ourselves. It also challenges us to stand up and speak out on behalf of those whose voices are too small to be heard. For them, we cannot remain silent.

READINGS FOR 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: This Old Testament book was probably written less than 100 years before Christ. It was written in the name of Solomon (the Wise) although he had lived almost 1000 years previously. It praises the goods of the mind and heart over riches and power. In today's gospel Jesus will introduce an even higher wisdom. 'In him wisdom has become love.'

2nd Reading: Jesus, the perfect image of our unseen God, is compared to a sword that penetrates through every defence. The writer had concerns about his hearers abandoning their faith. "We must press forward to enter our place of rest." (v. 11). The Promised Land of old is used as a 'type' or foreshadowing of our place of rest, both in this life and the next, as Jesus's own adopted brothers and sisters.

Gospel: Jesus looked long and hard at the young man, who from his youth - had kept God's Commandments. He 'loved' him and issued an invitation. The young man had typified the best of Old Testament wisdom. Yet sadly his attachment to wealth smothered this divine vocation (calling) to an even greater wisdom. He would not leave everything to join Jesus in spreading the Good News of divine love.
