FORGIVING OTHERS

We hear in the Gospel today that we must forgive seventy-seven times (or sometimes the translation is seventy times seven). This is not an actual number or a tally chart that we mark off each time we forgive until someone has used up all their chances with us. It is a number representing a perpetual giving of our mercy. Why does Jesus ask us to do this? It is simple. Because God does it for us. Yes, it can be hugely difficult to forgive deep hurts and wrongs done to us, but we are asked that we keep our hearts open to the possibility, or the grace, that we would find it within ourselves to forgive those who have wronged us.

Pope Francis said to a group of young people in 2016:

"Is it possible to forgive totally? It is a grace we must ask of the Lord. We, by ourselves, cannot: we make the effort, as you have done, but forgiveness is a grace that the Lord gives you. Forgiving your enemy, forgiving those who have hurt you and those who have done you harm. When Jesus in the Gospel tells us, 'If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also', it means this: leave this wisdom of forgiveness, which is a grace, in the hands of the Lord. But we must also do our part to forgive. And there is also another attitude that counters this terrorism of language, whether they may be gossip, or insults: it is the attitude of meekness. Stay silent, treat others well, do not respond with something else that is bad. Like Jesus: Jesus was mild of heart. And we live in a world where we are used to responding to an insult with another. We insult each other and there is a lack of meekness. Ask the grace of meekness, of meekness of heart. And there we also find the grace that opens the way to forgiveness."

READINGS FOR 24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Eccles (Sir) 27:30 - 28:7. Penned about 190 BC by Ben Sirach, a faithful Jew who had devoted his life to the pursuit of wisdom. "Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner." It is a non-negotiable element of the covenant with the Most High that to be forgiven we must forgive.

Rom 14:7-9. We are social beings. Our education, our entertainment, our media, our elected government, our laws, our commerce, our worship – most of our day-to-day concerns involve others. Hence we all affect one another. "Alive or dead we belong to the Lord."

Mt 18:21-35. The 10,000 talents mentioned would amount to over €50 million today (Jer. Bible)! The debt of gratitude we owe the Lord for re-opening to us the gates of paradise is likewise fantastic. The debt of 100 denarii would amount to less than a day's wagies. If we don't forgive paltry human debts neither will our own offences against God – to whom we owe everything - be forgiven
