ASH WEDNESDAY & LENT 2021

"Remember you are dust and to dust you will return" are the words we traditionally hear as Ashes were placed on our foreheads during Ash Wednesday. This year, we will not have the Ashes placed on our foreheads, so we must still try to hear those powerful words echoing in the ear of our hearts. The sign of the cross was indelibly placed on our hearts and souls in baptism. During Lent we should remind ourselves that we are Christians, people who have been claimed for Christ and redeemed by him. Although we might not bear this mark on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday this year, we should still try to leave our mark by the way we live our lives during Lent.

How do we do this? By turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. By being kind and generous, happy and helpful. By letting go of anger and hurt, bitterness and resentment. By being positive and content; by smiling instead of scowling.

Doing little things well is important. This year, given the restrictions we have to live under, each Wednesday morning, beginning on Ash Wednesday, a 7.15am Mass will be streamed on Facebook across both parishes of Burt, Inch & Fahan and Desertegney & Lower Fahan. Mass at 10am will be streamed on the Webcam from Burt. On Friday mornings, although there will not be Mass from Burt, Mass will be streamed from St Mary's Oratory, followed by a five minute moment of Catechesis and Stations of the Cross. Then, each evening at 10pm, a short Night Prayer will again be streamed to the Facebook pages of both parishes. The Stations of the Cross will be recited each Sunday evening at 6pm in Burt.

It is hoped that these additional moments of prayer and reflection will help us to make progress in coming closer to God and one another during Lent. These will mark out our time and, in turn, make a good mark on our lives.

Lord, keep our hearts tuned to yours during Lent so that we can walk together as friends towards Easter joy.

READINGS FOR 6TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: One needs to read through chapters 13 and 14 of Leviticus to appreciate the full depth of the leper's misery. Leprosy involved both body and soul in the i first millennium BC. Even if he recovered he had to undergo an elaborate religious rite of purification. To be completely cured therefore would be like being called back from ithe dead. Hence today's psalm: I turn to you, Lord...and you fill me with the joy of salvation.

Second Reading: Today's reading ends the letter. In Corinth the meat from sacrifices to false gods was often sold in butcher's shops. St Paul assures his converts that although they need not be worried about buying and eating it, they must at all costs avoid giving scandal to those who might imagine that Christians supported such sacrificing, thereby impeding their acceptance of the Good News.

Gospel Jesus' mission was to redeem mankind from the leprosy of sin. His response to the leper was immediate. But his reputation as a healer now spread like wildfire, obscuring and compromising his mission to free people from the depth of their sin and alienation from God.
